Pasi Eerikäinen (b. 1979) plays 1.st violin in Finnish Radio Symphony Orchestra. He performs as a soloist and chamber musician. Eerikäinen will be open to different music styles and phenomena. He has become known as a violinist of Tjango!, Jousikaiku Quartet, Riku Niemi Orchestra. Performing the music of our time is an integral part of Eerikäinen's character. He plays in Uusinta Chamber Ensemble and he has made several recordings for the Finnish Broadcasting Company. As concert master, Eerikäinen has worked in the Turku Philharmonic Orchestra, Chamber Orchestra of Lapland and Oulu Symphony.

Pasi Eerikäinen completed his Master of Music at the Sibelius Academy in 2006. He began studying violin in Kobe, in his native country of Japan. When he moved to Finland with his family, he continued violin lessons at the Rauma Music School as a student of Raoul Gothóni and Åke-Erik Renqvist. Later he continued studying at Tampere Conservatoire with Eeva Koskinen. At Sibelius Academy, his teachers were Petri Aarnio and Mi-Kyung Lee. Eerikäinen has also received remarkable influences from master classes and private lessons of Chaim Taub, Ana Chumachenko, Gerhard Schulz, Hagai Shaham, Tuomas Haapanen, Ilmo Ranta, Liisa Pohjola and Ralf Gothóni.
